CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order By Councilor Reese at 1830 Hrs.

ROLL CALL

Present were: Councilor Reese, Councilor Smeltz, and Councilor Deering

Also present: Mayor Bradley, Police Chief Williams

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Agenda adopted by Councilor Smeltz, seconded by Councilor Deering

PUBLIC INPUT

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes for the regular Public Safety Committee meeting held on April 25, 2016 were approved on a motion by Councilor Smeltz and a second by Councilor Reese.

FDMJ REPORT

EMA REPORT

Ken Barto reported that an additional site was reviewed and verified it is ready to use if necessary.

Mr. Barto also reported that he will be retiring in 2017 and a new coordinator will have to be found.

OLD BUSINESS

Disruptive Property

Changes to the draft ordinance emailed to all members. Clarified that failure to comply with the ordinance will limit renting a specific unit, not the entire rental property. A motion was made by Councilor Smeltz to move the ordinance to Council for review; second by Councilor Deering. Motion passed unanimously.

Chief Williams reported that the final ISP will go out to all concerned parties on Wednesday prior to the parade.

Taste of Mount Joy/Car Show

Chief Williams reported that he received email from PennDOT authorizing the closure of streets for the event.

Radar Speed Sign

Chief Williams reported the purchase order is complete and delivery is expected by the end of June.

Parking 44-48 E Main Street

NEW BUSINESS

Bridge Boulevard

Councilor Deering reported that residents are requesting No Parking signs be installed when the repaving project is completed. Chief Williams reported that Public Works will have to amend the parking ordinances and forward to this committee for review and approval.

Noise Ordinance Exemption

Chief Williams received a request for exemption to the noise ordinance from the Mount Joy Cyclones for June 11 and June 18. A motion was made by Councilor Smeltz to grant exemption and second by Councilor Reese. Motion carried.

BUDGET

Budget report submitted by Chief Williams showing line items that have exceeded the budget. Overall, the budget is on track for the year. Chief Williams pointed out that there was a billing error for the phone in which reimbursement is expected.

Chief Williams reported that the laptop computers will be ordered as soon as specifications are received. Once the specifications are approved, a purchase order will be cut and delivery will be in two to four weeks.
